




Thomas Causey III b. 1749 d. 1775 Caroline County, Maryland: His Descendancy

Assessment and Conclusions

Estate Inventory of Thomas Causey, Jr. d.1775 in Caroline County, Maryland, who was son of Thomas, husband of Rosanna Hubbert Causey. Two men signed as “nearest of kin” Zeblon Causey and Tho. Causey 3^d (III).

Thomas Causey-III was son of Thomas Causey, Jr. who was son of Thomas Causey, Sr. who died 1776 in Caroline County, Maryland. It has become apparent that Thomas Causey-III, after his father and grandfather's death migrated south through Guilford County, North Carolina, then west finally resting in Montgomery County, Tennessee. He had two sons Thomas and Robert. (Robert is listed on the 1800 US Census in Guilford County, North Carolina). They arrived in Montgomery County, TN before 1817. Thomas is listed on the Montgomery County, TN US Census in 1820 as age "over 45" then on the 1830 census he is listed as age 80 to 90. This would make him born between 1740 and 1750. In all my research I have found no other Thomas Causey born in that decade save Thomas Causey-III.

These documents strongly suggest that the Thomas Causey families who migrated to Vandalia, Fayette County, Illinois are descended from Thomas Causey III, not his brother Nehemiah Causey Sr. of Guilford County, North Carolina. I decided against Nehemiah since no “Nehemiah” is found in the Thomas Causey III line whilst many “Thomas” follow. In the following pages analyze the names, relationships, age and other family information over the time period 1749 through 1850 to determine if you agree that there is a strong probability that the Thomas Causey who was past 80 years old at the 1830 US Census in Montgomery County, Tennessee can be no other than Thomas Causey III, son of Thomas Causey Jr. d. 1775 in Caroline County, Maryland. PS: There is a Y-DNA connection to Robert and Thomas that I’m working on. More on that later.

Thomas Causey Age 80-90

Say age 85 from 1830 = b. 1745

Also listed with Thomas Causey is a male age 50-59 (b. bef. 1780)

Thomas Wesley Causey? and his children, six boys and 5 girls. Some may be grandchildren of Thomas Wesley. One may be a daughter-in-law. Three generations in this household.

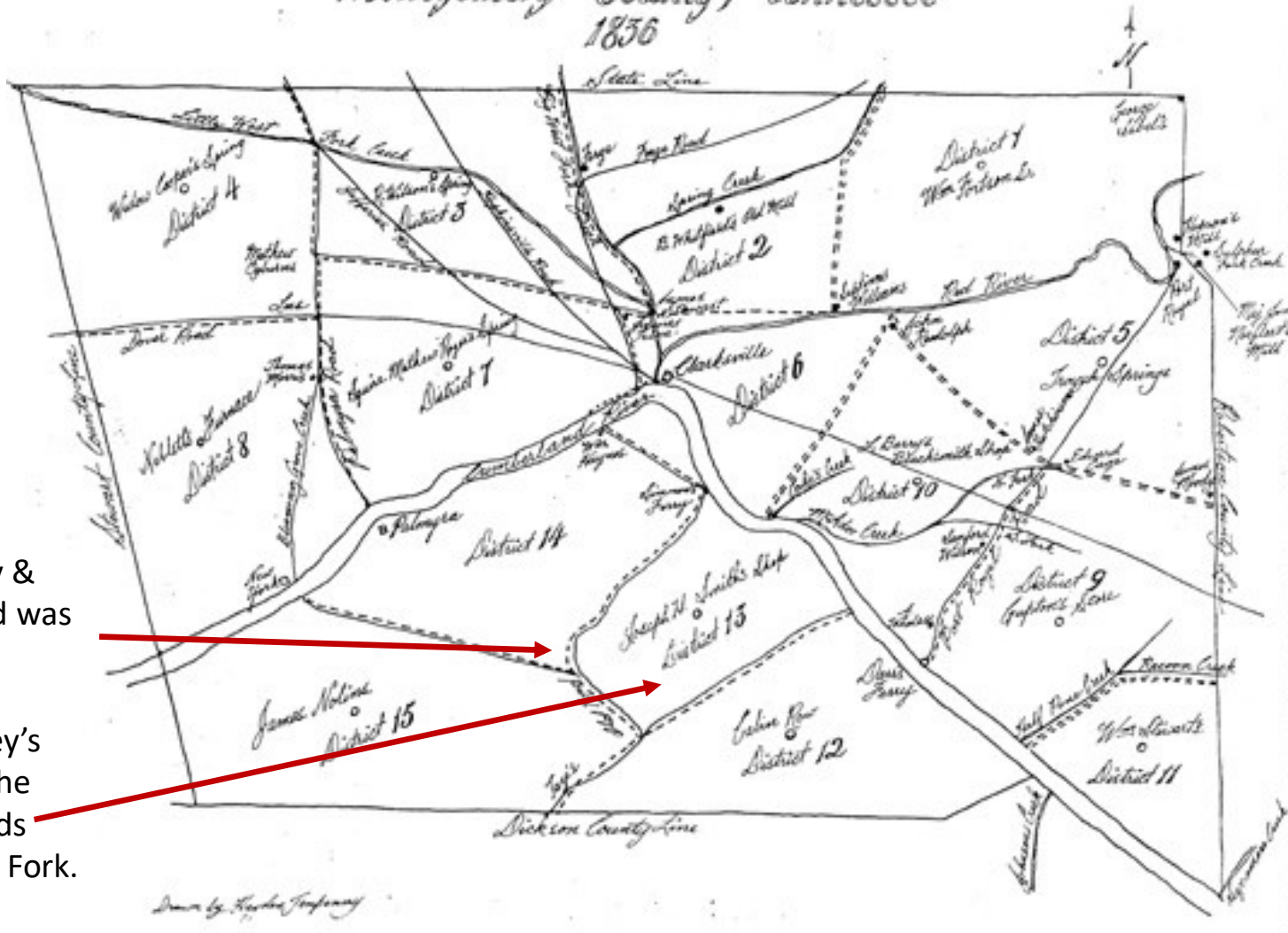

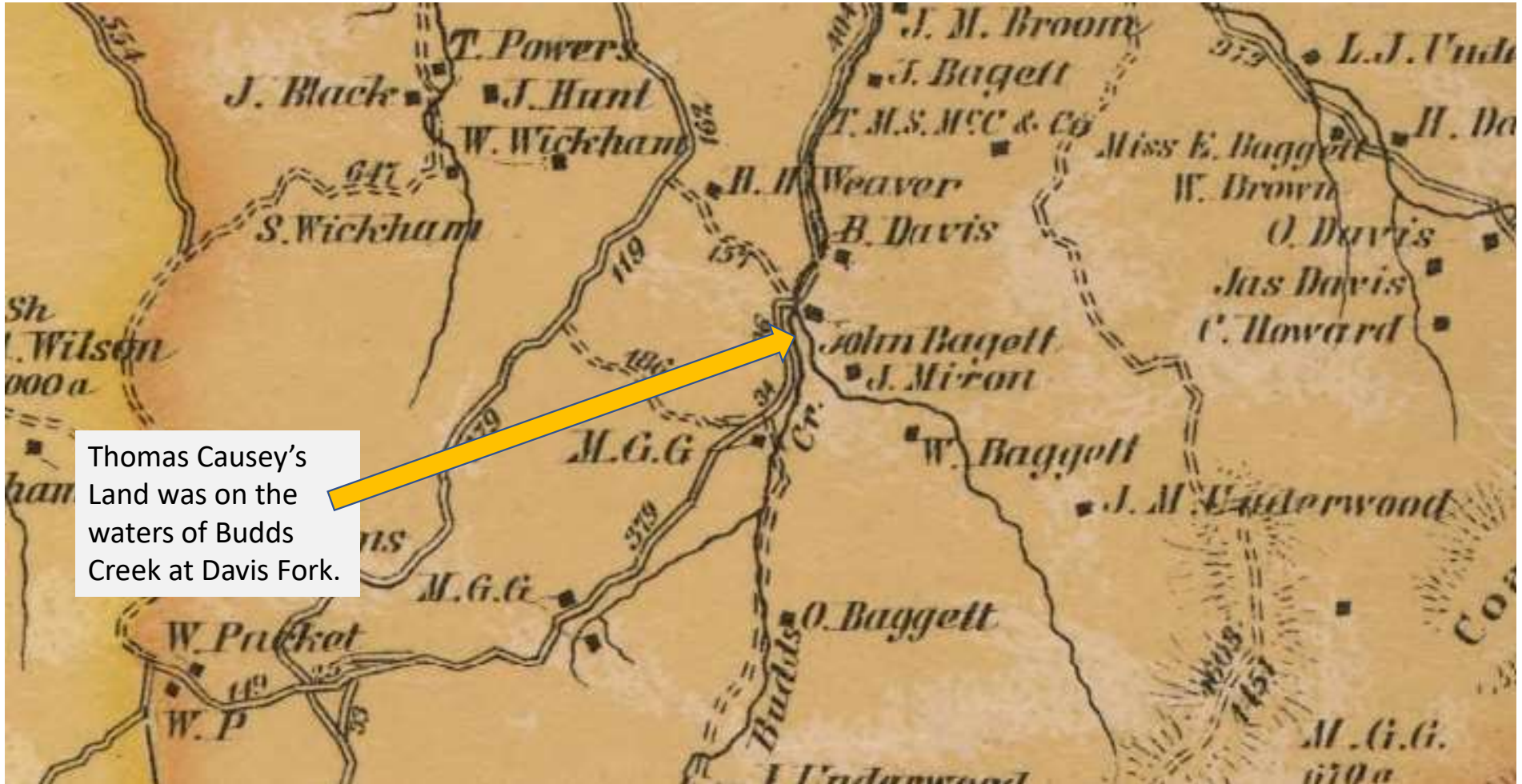

By the 1850 US Census, Isaac Causey and wife Polly were 35 years old. His father Robert Causey died sometime after the 1840 US Census. Isaac continued to live at the old Robert Causey place there on Budds Creek near all the Baggett Clan. Sometime after the 1850 US Census Isaac Causey and his family also relocated to Fayette County, Illinois. There are no further records in Montgomery County, Tennessee nor in Fayette County, Illinois of Robert Causey, Jr.

By 1830, Eaton had married a second time to Mary Causey, probably in Montgomery County. Mary was born about 1803, also in North Carolina. The Montgomery County, TN, census lists for 1830, 1840 and 1850 record Eaton and Mary as residents.

Mary probably helped raise Eaton's first three children. Eaton and Mary's first child, Nancy Elizabeth, was born on Apr. 26, 1830, in Clarksville, TN. Seven more children were born to Eaton and Mary in Tennessee, probably in Montgomery County. They were Warren Harp Powell (b. 1833), Rosa Catherine (b. Sep. 26, 1836), Willie R. "Wiley" (b. 1837), Robert H. (b. 1839), Susan (b. 1841), William (b. 1843) and Solomon (b. 1850).

Eaton's three oldest known children married in Tennessee. His first son by Holley, Benjamin, married (probably by 1835) Nellie Causey, daughter of Robert Causey. Eaton and Holley's second son, William C., married Rhoda Stafford Causey in Clarksville May 11, 1837. Rhoda's parents, Thomas W. and Mary/Polly (Swift) Causey moved to Fayette County, IL, that same year, probably after the wedding. Eaton and Mary's firstborn, Nancy, married Richard Vaughn, son of Michael and Frances (Nazworthy) Vaughn, on Feb. 1, 1849, in Montgomery County. This was the last marriage in Tennessee for one of Eaton's children. All the rest were married in Illinois.

The Causey, Baggett, Powell, Bone, and Hubbard families intermarried in Montgomery Co. TN. There were two Causey families, brothers who moved to this area from Guilford Co. NC. They were Robert and Thomas. I know very little of what happened to Robert, but the two of them did own land jointly as early as 1816.....

Indenture: deed dated Dec. 23, 1816, Montgomery Co. TN, Deed under the names of Thomas and Robert Causey. Location: Budds Creek.

Bought from Christopher Thomas

Witnessed by: Thomas Swift & Thomas Chance

Bought for \$150 - 44 acres of land in Montgomery Co. TN on the South side of Cumberland River and on the head branches of Budds creek.

Thomas and his wife and several of their 15 children moved to Fayette Co. IL circa 1838-40. My direct line was William Powell and wife Rhoda (Causey), dtr of Thomas. William's brother, Benjamin Powell was married to Nellie Causey, a daughter of Robert Causey. They also moved to Fayette Co. IL. Thomas and Mary/Polly Causey are buried in the Causey Cemetery in Fayette Co. IL. I have pictures of their headstones.

As I said, Baggetts, Bones and Hubbards also married with Causeys. Also it is my feeling that Malinda/Belinda Powell who married Henry Baggett in Montgomery Co. TN was a sister to William and Benjamin Powell.

It is very confusing, but you must remember that these families traveled together and often married members of their good friends' families.
