

Documenting Hubbert Causey

Hubbert Causey was born in Dorchester Colonial Maryland in the early 1750s. The purpose of this document is to present prima facie evidence(evidence sufficient to establish a fact or to raise a presumption of fact unless rebutted), that Hubbert, aka Hubbard Causey was born to Thomas Causey, Jr. and his wife Roseannah Hubbert about 1752. Furthermore, that Aaron Causey of Stewart County, Tennessee and Luke Cossey of Hardin County, Tennessee are sons of Hubbard Causey (1752-Bef.1820).

In the name of God Amen

this 25th day of May 1773 I John Hubbard of Dorchester County being very weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for it and willing to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into Gods that gave it me and for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the Direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same againe by the mighty power of God and as touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of in the following manner and form

Item I give and bequeath unto my eldest daughter Rozeanah Causey the wife of Thomas Causey one horse and a row and ralf and one feather bed and furniture and one months worth of my negro man and my flax harkle

Item I give to my granddaughter Mary Dismann one iron pot the wife of William Dismann
Item I give to my youngest daughter Sarah Daffers the wife of John Daffers one shilling
Standing to be her full part and to have no more

Item I give and bequeath to my son ~~John~~ ^{James} Dubboitt all my household goods negroes lands and Tementents and to be my sole Executors and I do hereby revoke Disannull and Swallow all and every other former Testaments Wills and bequeaths ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above written

Thomas Causey, Jr. was born before 1720 in Dorchester Colonial Maryland. He married Rozeanah Hubbard daughter of John Hubbard d. 1773. They had sons: Zebulon Causey b. c1739, Thomas Causey 3^d d. 1775, Hubbert Causey, and William Causey.

Rozeanah Hubbard had brothers named Nehemiah, Solomon, and Samuel. These names were used to name some of their children and/or grand children.

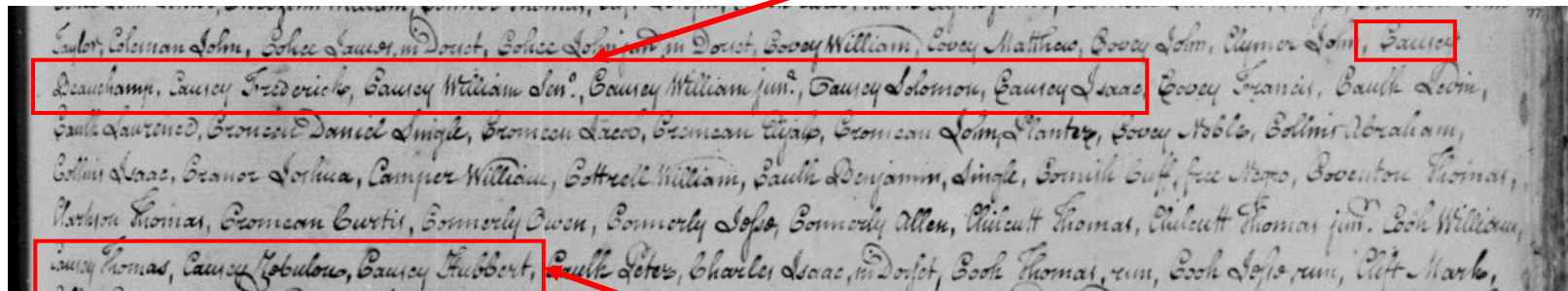

EXTRACTED FROM THE 1778 "OATH OF ALLEGIENTS" CITED ABOVE:

"Caroline County. Be it remembered that at a County Court held for Caroline County at Melvills warehouse in the said County the third Tuesday in March in the year of our Lord Seventeen Hundred and Seventy Eight Thomas Wynn Goocherman Constable for Great Choptank Hundred delivered into court an Alphabetical List of all the free Male Inhabitants, residents in his Hundred, of the Age of Eighteen years and upward, which said List is as follow to wit..."

Sons of Thomas Causey, Sr.: Beauchamp, Frederick, Isaac, Solomon, William Sr. and son William, Jr.



The named sons of Thomas Causey, Jr. Zebulon, Thomas the 3rd and Hubbert are shown separated from their uncles list above, is an indication they are probably brothers. A fourth son could be William.

NOTE: Thomas Causey-3, Zebulon Causey, and Nehemiah Causey have all migrated to Randolph, Guilford, and Rowan Counties, North Carolina by early 1780s. Hubbard Causey followed them to Rowan County soon after the above census. Aaron Causey, son of Hubbard Causey is shown on the 1880 US Census by his daughter Hester to have been born in Maryland.

Hubbard Causey and brothers Zebulon and Thomas Causey III and many others of the Caroline County, Maryland Causey Clan took to the Great Wagon Road south to Guilford, Randolph, and Rowan Counties in North Carolina, well before 1800. Zebulon Causey 1790



It appears that Hubbard Causey (1752-bef.1820) had at least three sons: Aaron (1780-1825), Luke (1787-1860), and John (1790-aft.1840).

Aaron is shown to have witnessed a will in 1801 and was, therefore born before 1781 to have reach his majority by 1801. Aaron is next shown to be in Stewart and Henry Counties, Tennessee. See documentation on Aaron Causey following.

Luke and John were listed as sons on the 1800 US Census in Rowan County, NC. John <10 years and Luke 10-15 years. On the 1810 US Census in Rowan County, NC John and Luke are both shown 17-25 years.

On the 1850 US Census of Hardin County, Tennessee Luke Cossey is listed at age 63 (b.1787) Maryland. Wife Sarah age 55 was born in Virginia.

Aaron CAUSEY was born c1780* in Caroline County, Maryland**. He died in 1826 at the age of 46 in Henry County, Tennessee. He married **Lydia Coleman** about 1804 in Clark County, Dodge, Georgia; she was born about 1785 in Clarke County, Georgia.

Aaron and Lydia had the following children:

Hubbard Asbury Causey, born 1805, Clarke County, Georgia, died about 1860, Henry County, Tennessee,

Hester Easter Ann Causey, born 1808, Guilford, North Carolina, She married **John Smith Wofford**, about 1828.

Maryann M. Causey, born 1821, Henry County Tennessee; died January 02, 1903, Shannon County, Missouri, She. married **James Monroe Wofford** on December 02, 1855, Dent, Missouri.

Mary Arminta Causey, born February 13, 1816, Henry County Tennessee, died March 16, 1898, in Wayne County, Missouri. She married **Daniel Wynn** on July 20, 1840 in Henry County, Tennessee.

Gabriel Lewis Causey was born in 1813 in Tennessee.

**Aaron Causey signed as a witness to the will of Josiah Finley 21 March 1801. He would have reached his majority (age 21) to have signed. Therefore, he was born on or before 1780.*

***Hester Ann Causey Wofford daughter of Aaron and Lydia Causey on the 1880 US Census listed her father's birthplace as Maryland.*

Derived from this document:

1. Aaron Causey b. c1780 Maryland. Based on English naming system his firstborn son would be named after his paternal grandfather. This system holds true for most of the Causeys then and now. If that be the case Aaron would be the son of Hubbard Causey as his firstborn bears that name.
2. Aaron married Lydia b. c1780 in Clark County, Georgia.

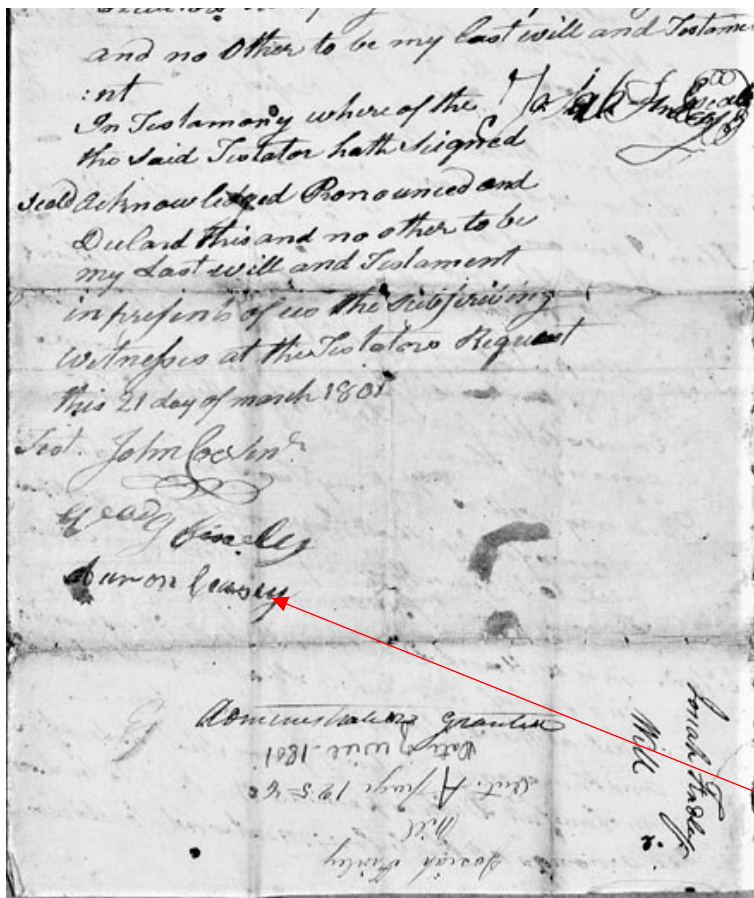

Aaron Causey, son of Hubbard Causey is shown here signing as a witness to Josiah Finley's will. Several conclusions can be drawn:

1. To be a legal witness one must have reached their Majority, age 21. This would determine Aaron Causey to have been born in or before 1780.
2. The image to the left is of the original will, not a transcription. This indicates Aaron Causey to be educated based on his signature.

Josiah Finley wrote his will on 21 March 1801. "For probate see Minute Docket No. 3, pps 125-6." The rest of the abstract reads:

Wife ALCEY - home plantation during life or widowhood

Wife, sons GEORGE & JAMES - to divide 370 acres of land

Dau BETSEY - negro woman Poll at death or remarriage of wife

My five daus: BETSEY FINLEY, RACHEL FINLEY, LETTIS FINLEY,

POLLY FINLEY & ABEGAIL FINLEY

Exrs: Wife ALCEY FINLEY, friend John Cunningham

Wits: John Coe, Senr., George Finley, Aaron Causey [Guilford Wills, A:0127]

Aaron Causey

Between the period 1801 to 1812 Aaron Causey had removed from Guilford County, North Carolina to Clark County, Georgia and there married Lydia Coleman. They very likely accompanied the John Wofford family. There also they had two children, Hubbard and Esther. They then moved with the Wofford and Colemans to Stewart County, Tennessee in 1810.

This Stewart County, Tennessee deed extract shows Aaron Causey had arrived in Stewart County by 7 January 1813, that is to say, by 1812.

John moved from North Carolina to Georgia by 1807, and in 1810 or 1811 moved to Stewart County, Tennessee. His descendents are known as "The Stewart Co. TN Woffords."

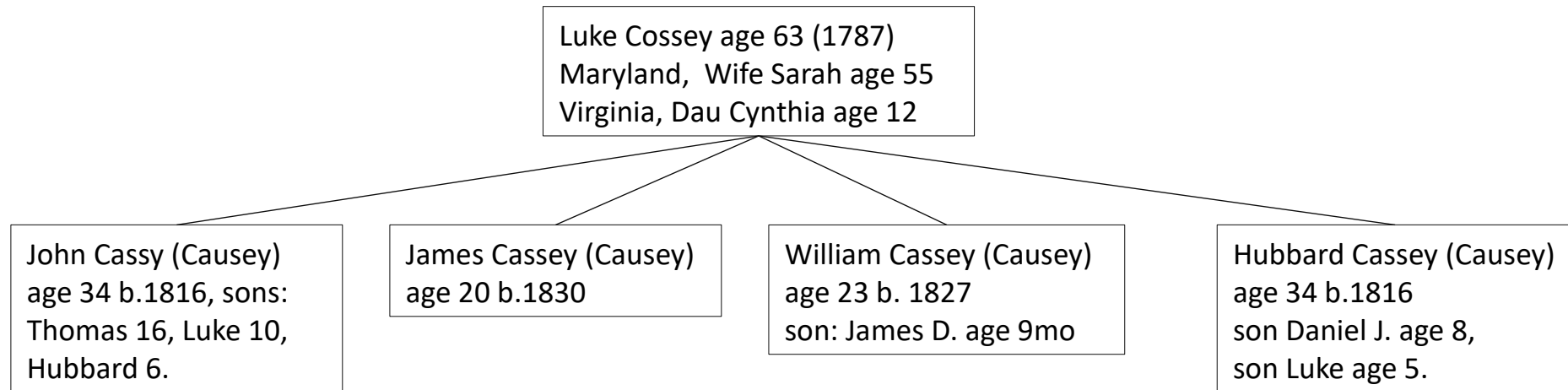

Conclusions

Factors impacting on the Conclusions:

- The surname Causey is relatively rare in America during the period of expansion between the Revolution and the Civil War.
- Y-DNA of descendants of Causey men from Mississippi, Alabama, Tennessee, Texas, and Georgia possess the rare haplogroup T-M70. So far in the Causey Y-DNA Project, all participant lines lead back to Maryland c.1700.
- Causey families have traditionally followed the British naming system where the first son is named after his grandfather. Maternal grandfathers are included in subsequent naming's as well as uncles.
- The most common Causey names are Thomas, John, and William. Least common names are Hubbard, Luke and Aaron.
- Associated Families. During the American Expansion associated families intermarried and migrated together. From Maryland to North Carolina associated families included Kirkman and Dawson. From central North Carolina associated families included the Wofford and Kirkman. This close association of families provided legitimacy to connections of Causey/Cossey lines.
- Tracking generation by age is an important factor. Mothers and fathers ages should generally fall in the range of their reproductive years, especially for mothers.
- Establishing dates of birth should be compared with dates of men reaching their majority age of 21. 15 year olds could not witness legal transactions.

Conclusions

Hubbard Causey b.1752 is most likely the 2nd or 3rd son of Thomas Causey Jr. (1720-1775) of Dorchester/Caroline County Maryland.

- His mother was Rosannah Hubbert daughter of John Hubbert (1695-1773). According to the Naming Convention the second son of Thomas and Rosannah Causey should be named John Hubbert Causey.
- Both sons of Hubbard Causey, Aaron and Luke, named their sons Hubbard. Aaron's first born. Luke's firstborn was named John. His second born was name Samuel Hubbard Causey after Luke's maternal uncle Samuel Hubbard.
- Rare Names. Very few Aaron and Hubbard Causey's can be found in US Census, Tax records, Land grants and deeds, or probate records.
- Based on documented facts associated with the above factors lead to a conclusion that:
 - Hubbard Causey b.1752 is the son of Thomas Causey, Jr.
 - Aaron Causey b. 1780 in Maryland and subsequently of Rowan/Guilford Counties North Carolina, Clark County, Georgia and Stewart/Henry Counties, Tennessee is, in fact, the son of Hubbard Causey (1752-Bef.1820).
 - Luke (Often listed as John Luke) Cossey b. 1787 in Rowan County, North Carolina and subsequently of Hardin County, Tennessee is also a son of Hubbard Causey (1752-Bef.1820).
